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AMENDED ORDER OF THE STATEWIDE 9-1-1 ADMINISTRATOR

I. Introduction

On or about October 7, 2022, a letter was sent to Sheriff Gary Caruana in his capacity as the Winnebago County ETSB Chairman regarding the need to bring the Winnebago County ETSB, and more specifically, the ROCKCOM Dispatch Center into compliance with the Emergency Telephone System Act. On or about January 25, 2023, an Order of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator was issued with respect to the above referenced Application for 9-1-1 Modification Plan.

II. Purpose of Modified Order

The purpose of this amended order is to stipulate that the order previously issued incorporates by reference the deadline provided in the October 7, 2022, correspondence. The January 25th order is incorporated herein by reference in its entirety.

III. Findings and Order

The findings of the January 25th order are not altered. The Order is amended as follows:

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator that pursuant to the Findings of Fact that the Winnebago County 911's request to add a Secondary Answering Point to their 9-1-1 System pursuant to paragraph 1325.415 of the 83 Illinois Administrative Code Parts is hereby approved;

All procedural changes required by the plan to bring the Winnebago County ETSB into compliance with the Emergency Telephone System Act are to be completed no later than June 1, 2023; and

This Order is a final administrative decision of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator subject to review under the Administrative Review Law, 735 ILCS 5/3-101. In the event you wish to seek review of or appeal this Order, you are advised:

1. Every action seeking review of such final decision shall be commenced by the filing of a Complaint and the issuance of Summons in the Circuit Court within 35 days from the date a copy of the decision was served upon the parties.

- 2. In your action seeking review you must name in the Complaint, and issue a Summons for, each party of record to the case other than yourself.

ORDER OF THE STATEWIDE 9-1-1 ADMINISTRATOR

I. Introduction

On, December 21, 2022 the Winnebago County ETSB ("Applicant") filed a Modification Plan Application with the Illinois State Police ("Agency") pursuant to the Emergency Telephone System Act ("ETSA") 50 ILCS 750/ and 83 III. Admin. Code 1325 "Standards of Service Applicable to 9-1-1 Emergency Systems" ("Part 1325"). Applicant seeks to add Mercy Hospital/ROCKCOM as a Secondary Answering Point (SAP). Mercy Hospital/ROCKCOM has been receiving 911 transfers from Winnebago County since 1991 and dispatches for eight rural fire protection districts but had not been included as a SAP in the Winnebago County 911 System.

The Winnebago County ETSB supported the Plan with documentary materials, including a narrative statement explaining the purpose for modifying the Petitioner's existing 9-1-1 plan.

The Mercy Hospital/ROCKCOM Dispatch Center completed a Secondary Answering Point (SAP) Operational-Technical Assessment on July 25, 2022.

The Office of the 9-1-1 Administrator is authorized to coordinate the modification of systems established under the ETSA. In order to secure compliance with the technical and operational standards for the development of local agency systems, the ETSA empowers the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator to approve or disapprove plans submitted by the public agencies. Standards of service applicable to 9-1-1 emergency systems, as adopted by the Department, are set forth in 83 III. Adm. Code Part 1325.

II. Description of Applicant

Applicant operates the 9-1-1 emergency services program in Winnebago County, Illinois. The Illinois Commerce Commission ("Commission") approved Applicant's 9-1-1 system in Docket No. 90-0440. The system became operational in January 1991. The System operates on a countywide basis with two primary Public Safety Answering Points, located at the Winnebago County Sheriff's E-911 Center, 4511 North Main Street, Rockford, Illinois and the Rockford E911 Center, 204 South 1st Street, Rockford, Illinois. The Winnebago County PSAP dispatches police and the Rockford PSAP dispatches police, fire, and ambulance

services.

III. Purposed and Description of Proposed Modification

Applicant is requesting to include the Mercy Hospital/ROCKCOM center located at 2400 North Rockton Avenue, Rockford, Illinois as a secondary answering point in their 9-1-1 System. The Mercy Hospital/ROCKCOM Center meets all the requirements for a SAP as prescribed in Section 1325.415 of Illinois Administrative Code Part 1325.

On January 10, 2023, Catherine Dailey, 911 Analyst, Statewide 9-1-1 Bureau filed a Technical Review to the Application. The Technical Review met the requirements of 83 Illinois Administrative Code Part 1325.

IV. Findings and Ordering Paragraphs

WHEREAS the modification plan seeks to add a SAP to their 9-1-1 System; and

WHEREAS the Mercy Hospital/ROCKCOM Center, located at 2400 North Rockton Avenue, Rockford, Illinois, meets all the requirements for a SAP as prescribed in Section 1325.415 of the Illinois Administrative Code Part 1325 – Standards of Service Applicable to 9-1-1 Emergency Systems.

SUBJECT: RockCom

Sheriff Carnana:

As we have previously discussed, the Winnebago County ETSB is currently not in compliance with the Emergency Telephone System Act. See 50 ILCS 750/7. In order to come into compliance, the ETSB will need to submit a modification plan no later than November 7, 2022. Since the RockCom Dispatch Center is currently receiving and dispatching fire and EMS calls within the Winnebago 911 System, the most expeditious remedy to this problem would likely be to have RockCom establish as a Secondary Answering Point (SAP).

However, whether the ETSB prefers this route or having the County PSAP dispatch its fire and EMS calls is a matter of local concern. Regardless, an approved modification plan and all procedural changes required by such plan to allow for either RockCom or the County PSAP to receive voice and data with the transfer of 9-1-1 fire and EMS calls must be completed by June 1, 2023.
