INTRODUCTION

Updates are submitted and processed on an ongoing basis, with new maps pushed on a monthly basis.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR THE WEST SUBURBAN CONSOLIDATED DISPATCH 9-1-1 SYSTEM AND JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD

WHEREAS, the Village of Rosemont (the "Village") is a home rule unit of local government and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs under Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution;

WHEREAS, units of local government may contract or otherwise associate among themselves to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine, or transfer any power or function in any manner not prohibited by law under 5 ILCS 220/1, *et seq.*, and Article VII, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution;

WHEREAS, the Village may establish a joint emergency telephone system board by an intergovernmental agreement under 50 ILCS 750/15.4;

WHEREAS, the Village's Public Safety Department recommends that the Village join the West Suburban Consolidated Dispatch 9-1-1 System and Joint Emergency Telephone System Board Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement attached and incorporated as Exhibit A (the "WSCDC IGA");

WHEREAS, the Village's corporate authorities find that approving the WSCDC IGA is in the Village's best interests for the protection of public health, safety, and welfare; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ROSEMONT, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULES POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: The recitals of this resolution are true, material, adopted and incorporated as Section One to this resolution.

SECTION 2: The Village's corporate authorities approve the WSCDC IGA. The Village's corporate authorities authorize and direct the Village President to: (1) negotiate and execute the WSCDC IGA; and (2) take all acts to effectuate the WSCDC IGA.

SECTION 3: This resolution shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such resolution should (a) contain terms contrary to the provisions of non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate regarding a manner not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the Village's corporate authorities that if the terms of this resolution are inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, this resolution shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 4: This resolution shall be immediately in full force and effect upon its passage and approval and subsequently be published in pamphlet form as provided by law.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN
INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT ESTABLISHING THE
WEST SUBURBAN CONSOLIDATED DISPATCH 9-1-1 SYSTEM AND
JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD**

WHEREAS, several units of local government, including the Village of Elmwood Park (the "Village"), have determined that the implementation of a 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System would provide a significant public safety enhancement to the citizens of each of the participating units of local government; and

WHEREAS, Public Act 99-0006 mandated the consolidation of Emergency Telephone System Boards (ETSBS) and Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPS); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 50, Section 15.4 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, 50 ILCS 750/15.4, authorizes the formation of Joint Emergency Telephone System Boards to oversee the implementation and operation of a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970 provides that units of local government may contract or otherwise associate among themselves to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine, or transfer any power or function in any manner not prohibited by law or by ordinance and may use their credit, revenues, and other resources to pay costs related to intergovernmental activities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 *et. seq.*) and Section 15.4a of the Emergency Telephone System Act (50 ILCS 750/15.4a), the Village is authorized to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement to establish the West Suburban Consolidated Dispatch 9-1-1 System (the "Intergovernmental Agreement"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Elmwood Park, County of Cook, Illinois as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are a material part of this Resolution and are incorporated herein as if they were fully set forth in this Section.

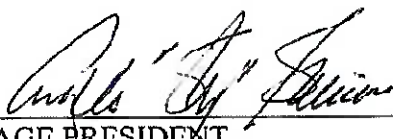
Section 2. The corporate authorities of the Village of Elmwood Park hereby approve the Intergovernmental Agreement and hereby authorize the Village President to

**WEST SUBURBAN CONSOLIDATED DISPATCH 9-1-1 SYSTEM
AND JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD
INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT**

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is entered into on the effective date specified hereafter, by and between the Village of Oak Park, the Village of River Forest, the Village of Elmwood Park, the Village of Forest Park, and the Village of Rosemont, units of local government signatory hereto and also any unit of local government which may become a signatory hereafter (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties"):

WHEREAS, the Parties have determined that the implementation of a 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System would provide a significant public safety enhancement to the citizens of each of the participating units of local government; and

WHEREAS, Public Act 99-0006 mandated the consolidation of Emergency Telephone System Boards (ETSBS) and Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPS); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 50, Section 15.4 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, 50 ILCS 750/15.4, authorizes the formation of Joint Emergency Telephone System Boards to oversee the implementation and operation of a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970 provides that units of local government may contract or otherwise associate among themselves to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine, or transfer any power or function in any manner not prohibited by law or by ordinance and may use their credit, revenues, and other resources to pay costs related to intergovernmental activities; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 provide for and authorize units of local government to jointly exercise powers common to each unit of local government; and

WHEREAS, intergovernmental cooperation is further authorized by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, *et seq.* (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Villages named herein (collectively referred to as "the Parties") are public agencies as that term is defined by the Act, 5 ILCS 220/2.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority set forth above and all other applicable laws, and in consideration of the mutual covenants and obligations contained herein, it is agreed between the Parties as follows:

1. Recitals Incorporated. The above recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth.
2. Venture Established. Pursuant to the intergovernmental cooperation authorized by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, and in recognition of the consolidation mandated by Section 15.4a of the Emergency Telephone System Act, 50 ILCS 750/15.4a, the undersigned units of local government hereby join together in a cooperative venture for the joint and mutual operation of a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system, to be known as the West Suburban Consolidated Dispatch 9-1-1 System and the West Suburban Consolidated Emergency Dispatch Center (collectively, "WSCDC"). Notwithstanding the foregoing to the contrary, WSCDC shall be an independent legal entity, and the relationship between the Parties and WSCDC System shall be an independent contractor relationship, and not a joint venture, partnership, or principal-agent relationship.
3. Joint Emergency Telephone System Board. There is hereby established a Joint Emergency Telephone System Board which shall consist of the Village Manager of the Village of Oak Park, the Village Administrator of the Village of River Forest, the Village Manager of the Village of Elmwood Park, the Village Administrator of the Village of Forest Park, the Village President of the Village of Rosemont or designee, and the Executive Director of the West Suburban Consolidated Dispatch 9-1-1 System. These same individuals shall also be members of the West Suburban Consolidated Emergency Dispatch Center Board.

Any subsequent participating unit of local government which joins the West Suburban Consolidated Dispatch 9-1-1 System shall be entitled to have one member seated on the Joint Emergency Telephone System Board. Designation of the new participating unit of local government's Board member shall be specified by the participant's enabling ordinance.
4. Bylaws. The West Suburban Consolidated Dispatch 9-1-1 System shall be subject to and shall be governed by certain Bylaws which shall be adopted by the Joint Emergency Telephone System Board together with any amendments which may be made in the manner and means provided in the Bylaws.
5. Participation. Each participating unit of local government in the West Suburban Consolidated Dispatch 9-1-1 System, and each unit of local government which may hereafter become a participant, is a member entitled to the rights and privileges of membership and is subject to the obligations of membership, all as may be provided in the Bylaws.
6. Termination. Any party to this Agreement may cease to be a party hereto and may withdraw from participation in the manner and means set forth in the Bylaws.
7. Powers of the Board. The powers and duties of the Joint Emergency Telephone System Board created by this Agreement shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

identify frequency etc.)

AID OUTSIDE JURISDICTION BOUNDARIES:

Once an emergency unit is dispatched in response to a request through the system, such unit shall
render its service to the requesting party without regard to whether the unit is operating outside its
normal jurisdictional boundaries.

The legislative intent is that 9-1-1 is used for emergency calls only. Therefore, all calls of an
administrative or nonemergency nature shall be referred to your agency's published telephone number.

The PSAP agrees to keep all records, times, and the location of all calls. All records will be available to all
participants of the 9-1-1 System.

It shall be the responsibility of your agency to maintain the report of the call and the disposition of each
call received. All agreements, management, records, and service will be the responsibility of the 9-1-1
Authority.

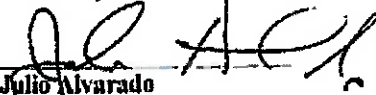
