SECTION II -SUPPLEMENTAL DATA

DOMESTIC RELATED OFFENSES, CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN, ATTACKS AGAINST SCHOOL PERSONNEL

In 1996, the Illinois State Police began collecting supplemental data statistics as mandated by state statutes. Supplemental data encompasses domestic related offenses, crimes against children, and attacks against school personnel. Training efforts throughout 2010 and 2011 increased agency participation and may have contributed to increases in the number and types of offenses reported as compared to previous years. Despite increased participation, many agencies are incapable of reporting supplemental data due to the limitations of their reporting systems.

Domestic Related Offenses

The reporting of domestic related offenses is mandated by Chapter 20 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, 2630/5.1. Domestic related offenses is defined as <u>any offense</u> attempted or committed where a domestic relationship exists between the victim and offender. Reporting is not limited to the offenses of domestic battery, violation of order of protection, criminal sexual assault, and other offenses generally associated with domestic violence. Domestic relationship is defined as family or household members, including spouses, former spouses, parents, children, stepchildren and other persons related by blood or by present or previous marriage, persons who share or formerly share a common dwelling, persons who have or allegedly have a child in common, persons who have or have had a dating or engagement relationship, and persons with disabilities and their personal care assistants or care givers outside the context of an employee of a public or private care facility. Agencies voluntarily submit domestic disputes where no offense has occurred.

Crimes Against Children

Although reporting in this category is not mandated by state statute, information is voluntarily submitted by agencies. This information provides statistics used to research the type and frequency of offenses committed against victims aged 16 years and younger.

Attacks Against School Personnel

The reporting of attacks against elementary and secondary school personnel is mandated by Chapter 105 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, 5/10-21.7. Select offenses committed against teachers, administrative personnel, and other school personnel by students are reported. Other school personnel includes teacher's aides, bus drivers, hall monitors, custodians, cafeteria workers, etc., who are employed by the school. An attack is defined as the offenses of criminal homicide, aggravated battery, aggravated assault, criminal sexual assault, battery, and assault. The offense need not have occurred on school grounds or during scheduled school day hours, as long as the victim was performing duties associated with their position when the attack occurred. The exception to this rule is when an attack occurs when the victim is not acting in an official capacity; however, the attack is motivated by actions the school personnel took against the student while acting in an official capacity.








Victim Gender 2010




Victim Gender 2011




