## I. POLICY

The Illinois State Police (ISP) will cooperate with the Illinois Secretary of State's Office in completing, when needed, a Medical Reporting and Re-examination Request (this form is supplied by the Illinois Secretary of State's Office).

## II. AUTHORITY

625 ILCS 5/6-207, "Secretary of State may require reexamination or reissuance of a license"

## III. PROCEDURES

- III.A. Officers will complete the Medical Reporting and Re-examination Request when the officer investigates a crash or an incident that requires police intervention and observes at least one of the following:
  - III.A.1. The crash or incident was the result of a possible/potential driver blackout, seizure, or attack of unconsciousness (not if the driver fell asleep unless as a result of a sleep disorder).
  - III.A.2. The crash or incident was the result of another medical condition (as determined through observing medicines in the possession of the driver or through the driver admitting the condition), including a mental, or vision condition.
  - III.A.3. The driver has demonstrated he/she apparently lacks the ability to safely operate a motor vehicle or to understand traffic laws.
  - III.A.4. The driver has displayed a lack of attention or performed a dangerous driving act that might be due to a medical problem or physical infirmity.

NOTE: These procedures apply to all drivers, including those licensed in another state.

III.B. Specific instructions for completing the Medical Reporting and Re-examination Request are on the reverse side of the form.
