

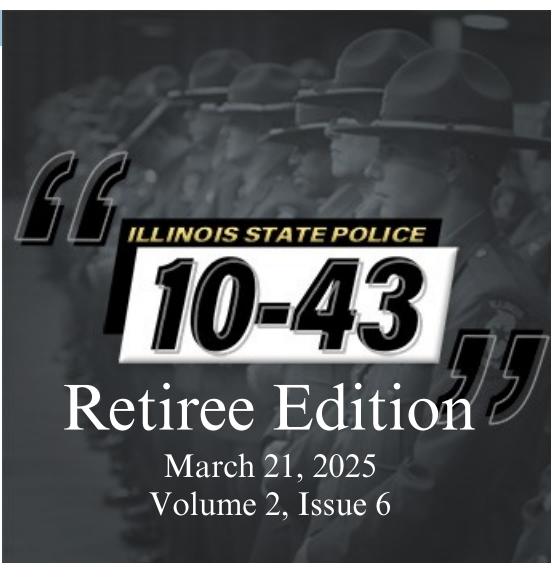
In Memoriam: retired Director Samuel Nolen

October 28, 1934 -
March 5, 2025
(age 90)



It is with sadness and great respect that I announce the death of Director Samuel Nolen. Director Nolen's career began as a Trooper in 1961 when he graduated first in his class from the Illinois State Police Academy. Throughout his career with ISP, he continued to excel as he held many key positions within the Department. Some of the positions he held included the Director for the Office of Operations Support and Planning (1975-1977), Assistant Deputy Director for the Division of Forensic Services and Identification (1977-1978), Deputy Director for the Division of Training (1978-1981), Deputy Director for the Division of Forensic Services and Identification (1981-1987) and as the First Deputy Director (1987 – 1991). He was appointed to serve as the Acting Director of ISP during the transition of gubernatorial administrations from Governor Thompson to Governor Edgar, a position in which he acted in from January to March of 1991. In January of 1999 he received the call to serve again when he was appointed by Governor George Ryan to serve as the Director of ISP, a position in which he served from 1999 until his retirement in 2003. Director Nolen left a lasting impact on the agency and with those he served. The visitation will be held on Thursday, March 13, at Wilson Park Funeral Home, 200 East Main Street in Rochester, Illinois, from 10:00am until the time of the Memorial Service at 11:30am. Burial will follow at 1:00pm at Camp Butler National Cemetery in Springfield.

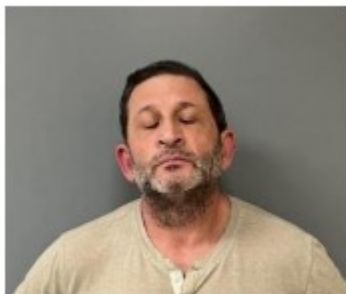
ISP LCMEG Arrests Two After Cannabis Investigation

LAKEMOOR – The Illinois State Police Lake County Metropolitan Enforcement Group (LCMEG) arrested 53-year-old Andrew H. Field and 28-year-old Emily A. Coleman, both of Wauconda, IL for one count of Unlawful Possession of Cannabis with Intent to Deliver over 5,000 grams (Class X Felony) and one count of Unlawful Possession of Cannabis over 5,000 grams (Class 1 Felony) each.

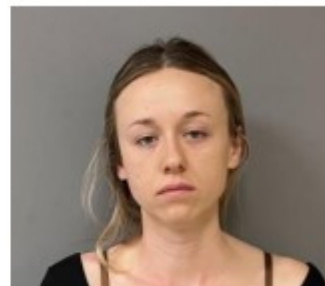
In November 2024, LCMEG agents were contacted to investigate an allegation of illegal cannabis manufacturing at a warehouse in Lakemoor, IL. Throughout the extensive investigation, LCMEG agents executed search warrants and seized evidence, which identified Fields and Coleman as suspects.

On March 5, 2025, officers executed additional search warrants at Milk and Honey Farm in Wauconda, IL and arrested Coleman and Field on charges of one count of Manufacturing / Delivery of Cannabis over 5,000 grams (Class X Felony), one count of Possession of Cannabis over 5,000 grams (Class 1 Felony), and one count of Calculated Criminal Conspiracy (Class 3 Felony). Field and Coleman were released on pre-trial conditions and await a further court date in McHenry County.

On March 11, 2025, based on additional evidence collected during the March 5, 2025 search warrant, Field and Coleman were issued additional arrest warrants in Lake County for Unlawful Possession of Cannabis with Intent to Deliver over 5,000 grams (Class X Felony) and Unlawful Possession of Cannabis over 5,000 grams (Class 1 Felony). The investigation remains open and ongoing, and no further information is available.

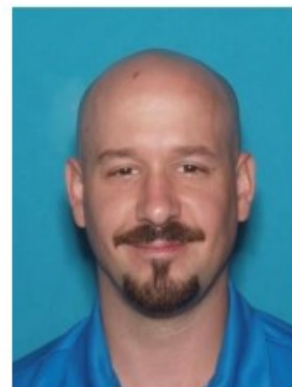

ISP Investigation Leads to Charges for Kidnapping and First Degree Murder in St. Clair County

DUPO – Illinois State Police (ISP) Division of Criminal Investigation Zone 6 special agents led an investigation resulting in charges against 39-year-old Kaylon T. List of Dupu, IL for First Degree Murder (Class M Felony), Aggravated Kidnapping/Inflicting Harm (Class X Felony), Kidnapping (Class 2 Felony), Concealing a Homicidal Death (Class 3 Felony), Aggravated Unlawful Restraint (Class 3 Felony), and Unlawful Restraint (Class 4 Felony).



Kaylon T. List (M/39)

On June 23, 2021, the Dupu Police Department requested ISP's assistance with locating a missing person, Eric Grindstaff. ISP and Dupu officers responded to List's residence at the 4000 block of Elm St. in Dupu. While at the residence, officers observed a suspicious vehicle partially hidden near List's home. A subsequent search of the vehicle revealed human remains, later identified as Eric Grindstaff. ISP and Dupu officers executed a search warrant at List's residence. During the search at the residence, weapons were recovered.

On March 3, 2025, the St. Clair County State's Attorney Office filed the six charges against List. List is currently being held at the Yankton Prison in South Dakota on the federal weapons charge and is awaiting extradition back to St. Clair County for ISP's charges. No further information is available.

NARCINT Seizes Cocaine and Heroin at Grundy County Truck Stop

ISP is targeting drug trafficking and keeping dangerous drugs out of communities. Thursday, March 6, 2025, ISP officers with the Narcotics and Currency Interdiction Team (NARCINT) seized more than 360 pounds of cocaine and nearly 90 pounds of heroin during an encounter in Grundy County.



ISP Seeks the Public's Help Obtaining Information About the Death of 17-year-old Christopher Pineda in 2007

BLUE ISLAND – The Illinois State Police (ISP) Division of Criminal Investigations Zone 1 continues to investigate the death of 17-year-old Christopher Pineda in 2007 and is asking for the public's help to provide any information that may help solve this case.

On Friday, March 30, 2007, the Blue Island Police Department (BIPD) responded to a call about a body found in the Little Calumet River near the area of Broadway Street and Aulwurm Drive. Upon arrival, they discovered a deceased male who had been submerged in water. BIPD requested ISP handle the investigation as the waterway was under ISP's jurisdiction. The male was later identified as missing 17-year-old Christopher Pineda of Chicago. Evidence indicated that Pineda had sustained blunt force trauma to the head and died as a result of those injuries.

According to Pineda's friends and family, on March 23, 2007, Pineda went to school at Whitney Young High School, and afterwards, he went with his girlfriend to her place of employment on the southside of Chicago. Pineda did not stay long and reportedly told his girlfriend that he was heading home. Pineda was last seen walking northbound on Ewing near 108th in Chicago.

At the time of his disappearance he was described as:

- Sex: Male
- Race: white/Hispanic
- Age: 17
- Height: 5'05"
- Weight: 150 pounds
- Eyes: Brown
- Hair: Black
- Clothing: Jeans, black polo with gold stripes, black hooded sweatshirt, gym shoes

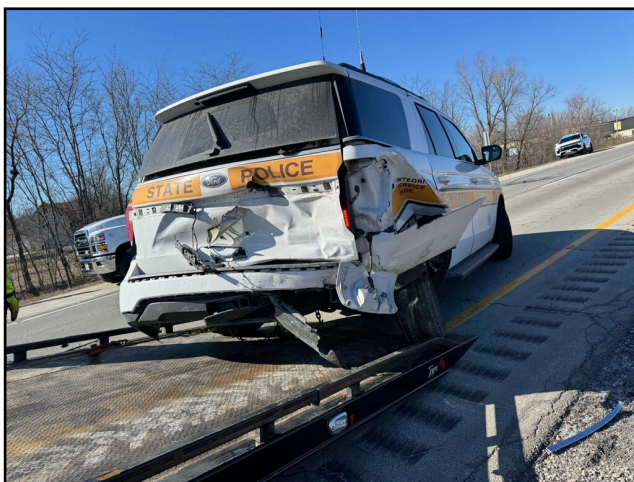
ISP Experiences 4th Move Over Law-Related Crash of 2025

ITASCA – Illinois State Police (ISP) officials investigated a traffic crash that occurred on Interstate 290 involving an ISP trooper, who was handling a previous traffic crash, when their squad car was struck by a driver who failed to move over.

On March 20, 2025, at approximately 8:18 a.m., an ISP trooper was handling a traffic crash on Interstate 290 westbound ramp to Illinois 390 westbound in Itasca. The trooper was parked on the left shoulder with emergency lights activated. The trooper was seated inside their squad car, and the squad car was struck in the rear by a Saturn Vue that failed to move over. The trooper was transported to an area hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The driver of the Saturn, 44-year-old Teresa Muro from Glen Ellyn, Illinois, was transported to an area hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. Muro was cited for Operating an Uninsured Vehicle, Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid an Accident, and a Scott's Law violation.

In 2025, ISP has already suffered four Move Over Law-related crashes. In 2024, ISP suffered 27 Move Over Law-related crashes with 12 troopers injured and one death. In 2023, ISP had 21 Move Over Law-related crashes with seven troopers injured. ISP reminds the public the Move Over Law, also known as "Scott's Law" in Illinois, requires all drivers to move over when approaching an emergency vehicle or any vehicle with its emergency or hazard lights activated.

A person who violates the Move Over Law faces a fine of no less than \$250 and no more than \$10,000 for a first offense. If the violation results in injury to another person, the violator's driver's license will be suspended for a mandatory period of anywhere between six months and two years. 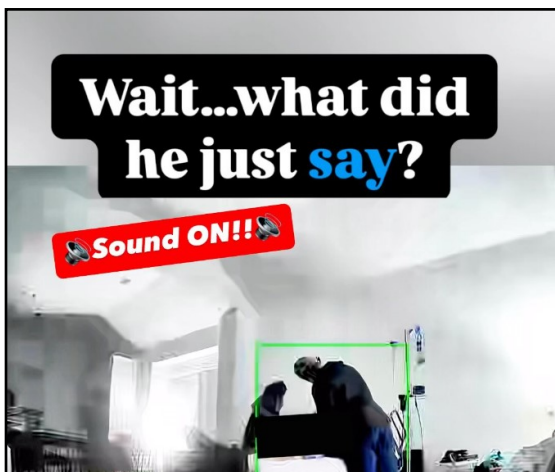
Putnam County Special Olympics Cool School Plunge

Sergeant Corwin McConkey succumbed to gunshot wounds he received during a traffic stop near Cisco, Illinois.

Sergeant McConkey was taken to John Warner Hospital in Clinton where he succumbed to his wounds two weeks later.

The suspect escaped but committed suicide two days later.

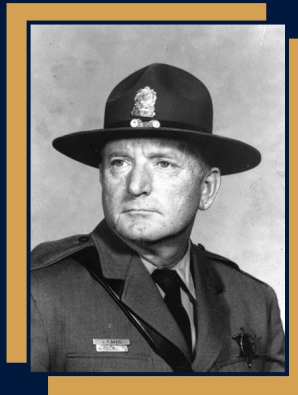
Sergeant McConkey had served with the Illinois State Police for ten years and was assigned to District 10. Sergeant McConkey was a WWII Navy veteran and was survived by his wife and two sons.

Trooper Layton Davis was shot and killed while making a traffic stop on Interstate 57, near Effingham.

Trooper Davis stopped a vehicle occupied by two escaped convicts. During the stop one of the escapees slipped a .357 caliber revolver into his waist band. As Trooper Davis frisked him, he spotted the revolver and a struggle ensued.

Trooper Davis was shot and succumbed to his injuries. Both escapees were apprehended and sentenced to 100+ years in prison.

Trooper Davis served with the Illinois State police for 19 years and was assigned to District 12. Trooper Davis was a WWII veteran and survived by his wife and three children.

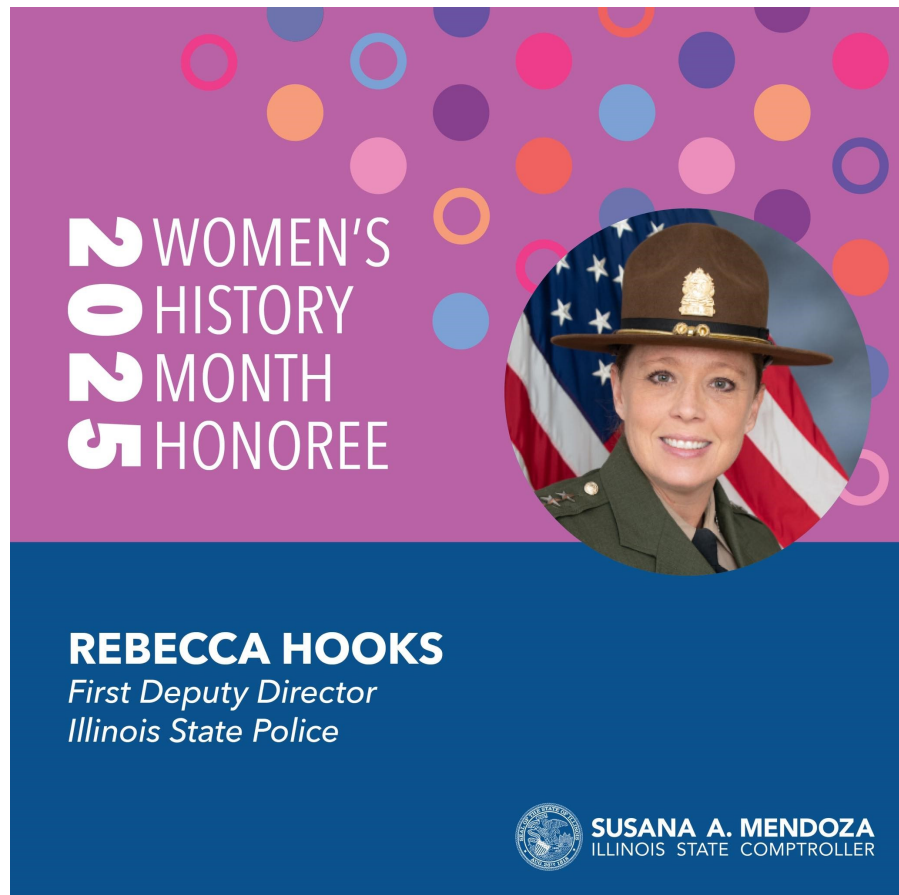
